How to Access the New Reference eBook Collections

- The six Reference eBook Collections have been added to the appropriate Explora interfaces, Science Reference Center and Consumer Health Complete. If your organization only links to these interfaces you do not need to anything else.
- If you link directly to MAS Ultra, MasterFILE, Middle Search or Primary Search and you want to make the complementary Reference eBook Collection available when these resources are searched you will need to link to a new URL that searches both resources. These combined URLs are available at search.more.net/databases.
- In some instances a library needs individual URLs for each resources instead of the combined URLs that searches both the main database and the Reference eBook Collection, for example, updating a discovery service. A list of the direct URL for each of the Reference eBook Collections is available at this FAQ that is located on search.more.net.
